



COVID-19 RESPONSE:

REPATRIATION OF SEAFARERS

The crippling pandemic encircling the globe has brought a unique set of challenges for the maritime industry. As governments raced to contain the virus, many countries closed their borders leaving seafarers unable to return home by through normal channels. We at Scorpio realize the increased stress and anxiety that extended time at sea places on our ship staff and have gone to great lengths to address their individual concerns. Through enhanced screening procedures and close cooperation with government authorities, we repatriated several of our ship staff to select ports of call. Once conventional measures were exhausted, we plotted a new uncharted course to secure safe passage via chartered aircraft. Through the coordinated effort of the Scorpio crewing staff, the Indian Ministry of Shipping, the Indian Ministry of Aviation, among others, we have successfully repatriated 5,600+ seafarers (including non-Scorpio crew) through 50 charter flights. As restrictions are lifted, we will continue to work to ensure business continuity and the safe return of our ship staff.
